Community Impact

Great Salt Lake Watershed Enhancement Trust

The <u>Great Salt Lake Watershed Enhancement Trust</u> (Trust) was established in January 2023 with \$40 million in funding from the State of Utah. The Trust, co-led by the National Audubon Society's Saline Lakes Program and The Nature Conservancy, aims to enhance water quantity and quality for the Great Salt Lake and its wetlands.

Over \$8.5 million was awarded through a RFP process in 2023 from the Trust for projects to protect and enhance the incomparable resources the Great Salt Lake provides. From improving the conveyance efficiency of the Jordan River to controlling invasive vegetation species that prevent water from entering the lake — these projects seek to ensure the Great Salt Lake is preserved for future generations.

Silicon Slopes Computer Science Fund

The <u>Silicon Slopes Computer Science Fund</u> (SSCSF) was established to respond to the need for computer science education, so that every child in Utah has the opportunity to learn and develop computer science skills. In August, SSCSF began a RFP process to identify projects to reach students from diverse backgrounds and provide access to computer science education.

Westminster University, Utah State University, Salt Lake Education Foundation, and Utah Coalition for Education Technology were awarded more than \$400,000 in funding to assist teachers with implementing computer science learning in their classrooms. These projects focus on expanding computer science integrated learning for 4th-6th grade students in rural schools, providing supplies and equipment for e-textile classes, and supporting a computer science conference for educators in indigenous communities.



Community Engagement

Morgan Stanley Fellowship

The 2023 cohort of Morgan Stanley Community

Development Graduate Fellows featured the rising talent of Utah's emerging nonprofit leaders. In partnership with Morgan Stanley, the Fellows were paired with nonprofit organizations to develop their skills, build their networks, and receive hands-on experience in community development work. Their projects ranged from closing real estate deals for affordable housing to organizing community events for families experiencing extreme poverty.

Ogden Circle of Giving

The Ogden Circle of Giving. (OCOG) was established by a group of philanthropists who wanted to create a sustainable giving model for their community. The OCOG awarded the first annual grantmaking cycle of the Dr. Ezekiel R. and Edna Wattis Dumke Foundation Charitable Fund in 2023. After careful consideration, the OCOG selected Seager Memorial Clinic and YCC Family Crisis Center for the Fall 2023 grant cycle. These organizations were granted \$29,000 each to make a positive impact for underserved communities of Northern Utah.

Utah Grantmakers Alliance

The Utah Grantmakers Alliance (UGA) serves as a learning community for local family foundations and donors committed to sharing best-practices to maximize their philanthropic impact. In 2023, UGA hosted Glen Galaich, CEO of the Stupski Foundation, for a conversation on foundation governance, building grantee relationships, and the Stupski Foundation's decision to spend down. As a follow on to Glen's discussion, UGA members shared their philanthropic intentions and practices in a peer workshop.

In 2023, CFU launched an inaugural <u>Social Sector Sabbatical</u> and our annual <u>Invest in Success</u> initiative. Executives from Utah nonprofit organizations were brought together to share their challenges and set intentions for a two week sabbatical. Simultaneously, a senior staff member from these organizations was nominated to participate in CFU's Invest in Success professional development initiative to help prepare them to step into any leadership gap while their executive was away. These paired initiatives demonstrate CFU's investment in retaining and developing top talent in Utah's social sector.


This year, CFU welcomed Trish Coughlin as Chair of the Board of Directors.
